Page requirements for your brochure
Page 1 = Title page (includes title, your name, hour)
Page 2 National Identity- include 1 picture with a brief statement describing the picture. What does it mean to identify with this country? What makes it unique in relation to other places? What role does the country play in the world? What are some beliefs of the country?
Page 3 State Identity- include 1 picture with a brief statement describing the picture. What does it mean to identify with this state? What makes it unique in relation to other places? What are some beliefs/priorities for the state?
Page 4 = City Identity- include 1 picture with a brief statement describing the picture. What does it mean to identify with the city? What makes it unique in relation to other places? What are some beliefs/priorities for the city?
Page 5 =  Neighborhood Identity-include 1 picture with a brief statement describing the picture. What does it mean to identify with the neighborhood? What makes it unique in relation to other places? What are some beliefs/priorities for the neighborhood?
Page 6 = Personal Identity- What are some folk/traditional cultural things that you still follow or believe are important? What are things that are tied more to popular culture? What makes you a unique individual?
